775 Joint Personnel Secure SEAPAC Meeting

TEMPO.CO, Medan - Police and Indonesian National Armed Forces (TNI) have mobilized 775 joint personnel to secure *South East Asia Parliamentarians Against Corruption* (SEAPAC) meeting 2013 which will be held in Medan, North Sumatera, October 23-24.

As many as 670 personnel are from North Sumatera Police. The rest is from the army, navy and air forces, with 35 personnel each.

objects and locations where meetings will be held are top priorities. Among them is Kuala Namu International Airport in Deli Serdang, Arya Duta Hotel, Grand Aston Hotel, and Governor of North Sumatra's residence office. Parking spaces of the delegates are also secured.

SEAPAC meeting consists of 20 state legislative heads. Some of them are from Thailand, the Philippines, Singapore, Saudi Arabia and South Korea. House of Representatives (DPR) spokesman Marzuki Alie and Coordinating Minister for Political, Law and Security Affairs Djoko Suyanto, and the Corruption Eradication Commission (KPK) will represent Indonesia.

Observer countries such as India, Canada, and Australia will also attend SEAPAC meeting. Other international organizations invited to the meeting are GOPAC Australian Region, South Asian Parliamentarians Against Corruption (SAPAC), Arab Parliamentarians Against Corruption (ARPAC), Transparency International, Stolen Asset Recovery, IIDEA, Civicus, and Global Youth Against Corruption.

There will be traditional dance performances in the General Assembly of SEAPAC and all delegates will have a tour to the tourist attractions such as Asam Kumbang Crocodile Farm, Maimun Palace and the famous Lake Toba.
